Post-Graduate News

Courses of instruction in medical and surgical subjects are arranged from time to time as the opportunity occurs, and may be attended by any medical practitioner, though a slightly higher fee is payable by those who are not Members of the Fellowship of Medicine. Detailed syllabuses of each course are prepared as soon as possible, and if post-graduates will notify the Fellowship of Medicine (1, Wimpole Street, London, W.1) of the subjects in which they are interested, their names will be entered on the appropriate mailing lists to receive copies, without charge, when published.

OXFORD: Department of Anaesthetics, Radcliffe Infirmary

An Intensive Revision Course of two weeks' duration is held in the Spring and in the Autumn, consisting of lectures and practical demonstrations. Fee, to Members of the Fellowship of Medicine, £10 10s. od.; to non-Members, £11 os. 6d. Applications must be made to the Fellowship of Medicine, *not* to the Radcliffe Infirmary, Oxford.

LONDON: Combined Hospitals

Revision courses, of two weeks' duration, are arranged from time to time. Lectures every afternoon at the Royal Cancer Hospital; practical demonstrations every morning at various general and special London Hospitals. Fee, to Members of the Fellowship of Medicine, £7 17s. 6d.; to non-Members, £8 8s. od.

Tuition is available for any period from a week upwards, and includes sessions on General, Thoracic, E.N.T., Genito-urinary, and Dental surgery. Limited to two post-graduates at a time. Fee, to Members of the Fellowship of Medicine, £2 2s. od. for one week, £4 4s. od. for two weeks (reduction for longer periods); for non-Members, the fee is 10s. 6d. more in each case. Application must be made to the Fellowship of Medicine, *not* to the Hospital.

FELLOWSHIP OF MEDICINE AND POST-GRADUATE MEDICAL ASSOCIATION MEMBERSHIP

Only qualified medical practitioners may become Members or Associates of the Fellowship of Medicine. The subscription rate, dating from the month of joining, and including the POST-GRADUATE MEDICAL JOURNAL, are as follows: MEMBERS: £1 1s. od. per annum; ASSOCIATES: 15s. per annum.

Members and Associates are entitled to pay lower fees for attendance at Courses of instruction arranged by the Fellowship of Medicine. (Associates are members of Medical Societies affiliated to the Fellowship of Medicine—a list of these Societies may be obtained on application to the Fellowship.)

The subscription rate to the POST-GRADUATE MEDICAL JOURNAL for practitioners resident overseas is 12s. per annum, post free, and this rate is also payable during the war by any practitioner serving with H.M. Forces, whether at home or abroad. Subscribers at this rate are not entitled to pay the lower fees, quoted to Members and Associates, for attendance at Courses of instruction.
