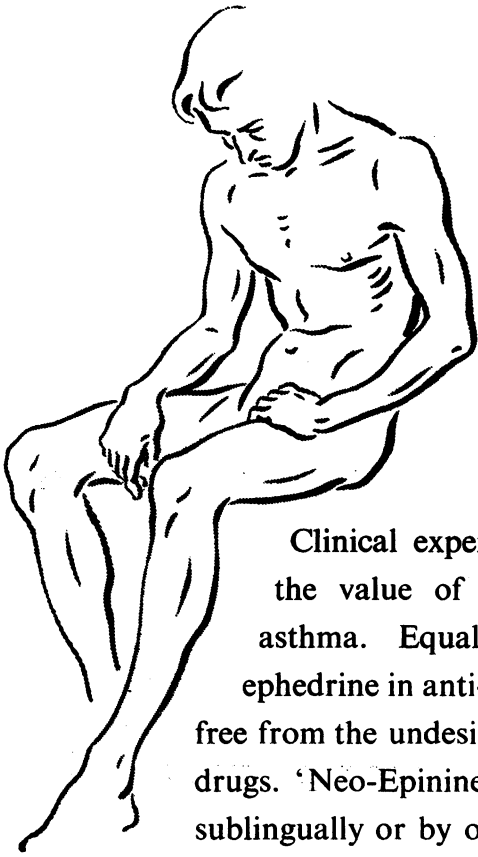
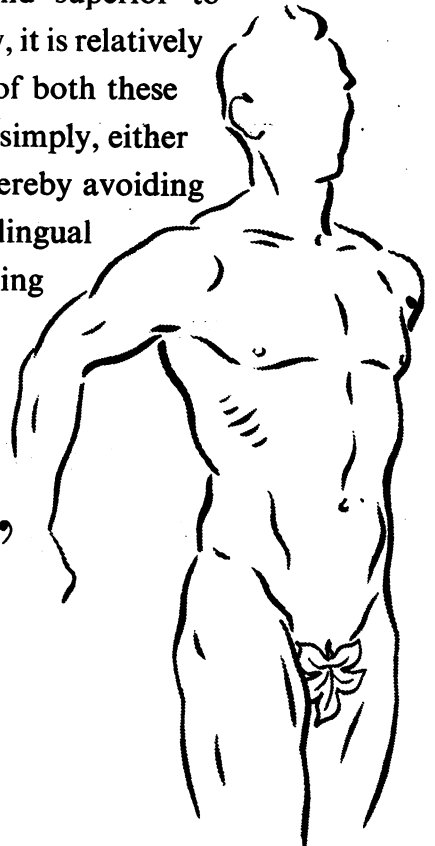

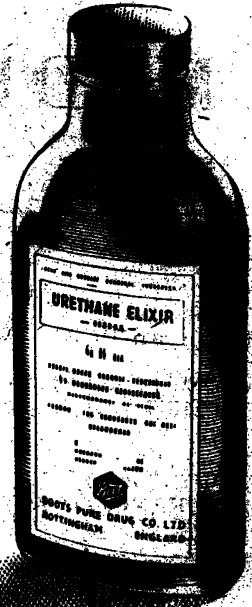

**MANCHESTER****University of Manchester**

**Radiology. D.M.R.T.(R.C.P. & S.Eng.).** A course of instruction will be given at the Holt Radium Institute, Manchester, from April 1st, 1949, to the end of January, 1950, with a month's holiday in August. Lectures and practical demonstrations will be given in the following subjects:—

Physics as applied to radiotherapy. *Mr. W. J. Meredith and Physics Staff.*

Biological effects of radiation. *Dr. E. Paterson and Dr. W. M. Dale.*

Pathology in relation to radiotherapy. *Prof. S. Baker and Dr. H. Russell.*

Principles and practice of radiotherapy. *Dr. Ralston Paterson and Radiotherapy Staff.*

Thereafter it is hoped that paid posts will be found for candidates in Radiotherapeutic Departments, where they may complete the attendance required by these regulations. All applicants will be required to attend for interview before being accepted for the course. It is important that applications should be sent in as soon as possible, as only a limited number can be accepted and it is necessary for each candidate to ascertain from the Secretary of the Royal Colleges whether he will be eligible to sit for the examination.

**D.M.R.D.(R.C.P. & S.Eng.).** A course of instruction will begin in mid-April, 1949, and extend over 18 months. The course is full-time, non-resident; fee, £52 10s. od. Applications must be sent before February 28th, and candidates must fulfil the requirements as to previous medical experience laid down by the Examination Board (D.M.R.D. Regulations, December, 1945), 8-11 Queen Square, London, W.C.1.
