### ANGLO-FRENCH EXCHANGE BURSARIES

Applications are now invited for the bursaries which will be awarded in 1962 to young British doctors under the exchange scheme arranged by the French Embassy in London between the Institut National d'Hygiene in Paris and the Ciba Foundation in London. The value of the French grants is NF. 870 a month, tax free, and they will be awarded for periods of two to four months to medical men who wish to obtain clinical experience or carry out research in France. Since the aim of the exchange is to spread in each country knowledge of methods, achievements and outlook on the other side of the Channel, preference will normally go to candidates who hold teaching posts or are in positions where they can pass on the experience they have acquired.

The British Selection Board is composed as follows: Professor Alexander Hadow, Professor John McMichael, and representatives of the British Council (Dr. Margaret Suttill), the British Postgraduate Medical Federation (Dr. C.
