POST-GRADUATE NEWS.

OWING to vacation three courses only will be held during August, and a few remarks concerning each may be of help to our readers. From July 29 to August 24 the staff at the All Saints' Hospital will provide a course in genito-urinary diseases, consisting of clinical and cystoscopic demonstrations. Fee £2 12s. 6d. From August 12 to August 24 the staff of the Queen's Hospital for Children will undertake a course. This hospital specializes in teaching by demonstration of cases rather than by lectures. The Wards and Out-patient Departments will be open continuously throughout the course. Fee £3 3s. Lunch and tea are kindly provided by the hospital authorities without charge.

Attention is directed to the facilities afforded for post-graduate instruction under the General Course scheme of the Fellowship of Medicine at the associated hospitals. Although many of the members of the honorary staffs are on vacation, in most, or in all cases, deputies are appointed to take their place, and it is thus possible for visitors to London to see something of the valuable clinical work that is being carried on. Intending visitors should therefore either write or call at the office of the Fellowship of Medicine for current particulars of this General Course, for which tickets, ranging from one week upwards to one year (£2 2s. to £21) are issued, enabling the holder to make out his own time-table to suit his requirements.

For the September special courses we would ask our readers to refer to the blotter at the end of the journal. We would also draw their special attention to the fact that the following additional special courses have been arranged for 1929. From September 30 to October 4 the Prince of Wales's Hospital, in conjunction with the North Middlesex Hospital, will provide a course devoted to gastro-enterology. The

course will occupy all day, and the fee will be £3 3s. From October 15 to December 6 the Fellowship of Medicine will hold its second M.R.C.P. course. This will comprise a series of sixteen lectures by well-known authorities,¹ on Tuesdays and Fridays, at 8.30 p.m., at the Medical Society of London, 11, Chandos Street, Cavendish Square, W.1. From October 21 to November 2 the Metropolitan Hospital Staff will provide their first intensive course in medicine, in surgery and the specialities. Fee £3 3s.

The Fellowship of Medicine is arranging a series of lectures on "Common Complaints." The lectures will be delivered at the Medical Society of London Lecture Hall on Mondays from October 14 to December 9 at 5 o'clock. These lectures will be open to the medical profession without fee.

The series of weekly demonstrations in medicine and surgery, also arranged by the Fellowship of Medicine, will be resumed in October. These likewise will be free to the medical profession.

The following information may be of interest to our readers. From September 30 to October 3 a post-graduate course on radium therapy will be held at St. Bartholomew's Medical College. The class will be limited to about thirty men, and preference will be given to those who are likely to work with radium. Fee £5 5s., payable to the college.

At King's College a course for the Primary F.R.C.S. will be begun on September 3 in Physiology, under the direction of Dr. Samson Wright, and on November 1 in Anatomy by Professor D. M. Blair. The dissecting room will be open during September and October. Particulars may be obtained from the Dean of the Faculty of Medicine, King's College, Strand, W.C.2.
