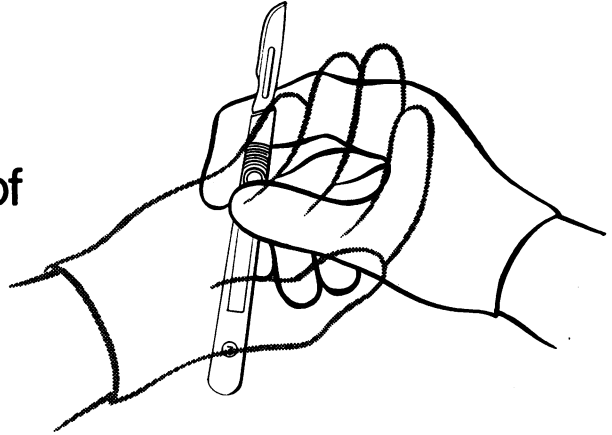

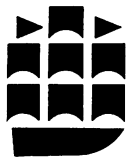

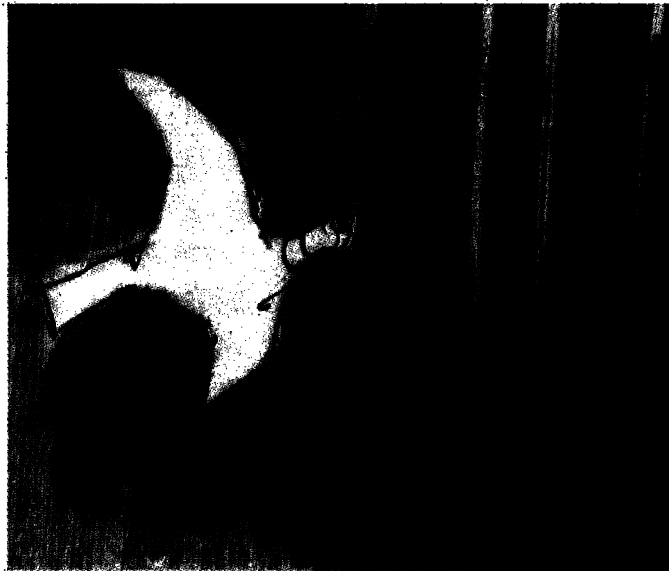
## Conybeare's textbook of medicine Sixteenth edition

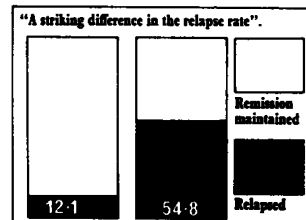
