The Treatment of Drinking Problems: A Guide for the Helping Professions

J. Griffith Edwards MA, DM, FRCP, FRCPsych, DPM, *Professor of Addiction Behaviour, Institute of Psychiatry and Honorary Consultant Psychiatrist, the Bethlem Royal and Maudsley Hospitals, London*

This very practical book describes the techniques and likely outcomes in the management of alcohol dependence, with extensive use of case histories. The author is probably the best known and most widely acclaimed expert in the field, and the text will be essential for GPs, psychiatrists, nurses, social workers and probation officers, as well as workers in voluntary organisations concerned with the treatment of alcoholism.
