

POST-GRADUATE NEWS.

A VARIETY of special courses will be held during November. From November 3 to November 29 the London Lock Hospital will hold a special course in Venereal Disease consisting of clinical instruction in the Out-patient Department. Fee £2 2s. This course occupies the afternoons and some evenings.
