A one-year course commencing in October 1984

This course is intended to provide intensive education, at postgraduate level, for approximately 15 students by formal lectures every morning and seminars every afternoon, with practical, individual training in diagnosis, new methodologies and therapy for groups of two to four students.

Phonocardiography Intensive cardiac care
Cardiac catheterisation and angiography

Cardiovascular pharmacology
Surgical aspects

Participation in Research Programmes is optional

The course for the diploma is open to graduates in medicine who will have at least six months specialist practice in cardiology before starting the course.

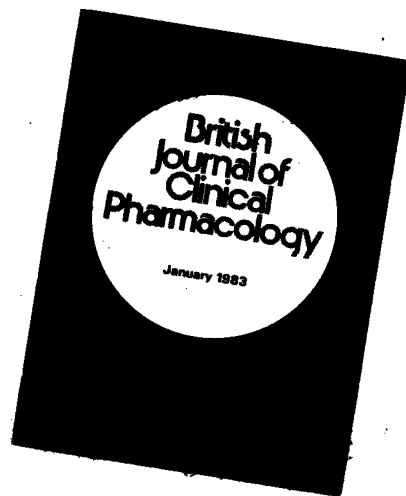
